

Intellectual Property Awareness

Creation and dissemination of knowledge is an important component of graduate education. Most graduate students will have to deal with intellectual property (IP) issues during their studies. This form is designed to promote early awareness of these issues thereby minimizing problems that may arise later. Each graduate student and her/his academic supervisor should complete and sign this form at the beginning of the research training. Students in professional Master's programs should complete the form with their Graduate Coordinator, if relevant. If a student's research is supported by industrial contract(s), or if the research may lead to major inventions or commercialization, the student and supervisor should consider signing a formal agreement, in consultation with the department, faculty,

School of Graduate Studies, or Office of the Vice-President, Research.
